

Background: KTWD has revised their Sphere of Influence with Tulare County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo) by excluding land. The LAFCo action occurred on August 5, 2010. This action will only affect the quantities of water delivered by the appropriate districts for the subject territory. There will be no upgrade needed to existing facilities as a result of the annexation. KTWD has requested that the Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation) change their contractor service area.






Figure 1. Kern-Tulare ID Detachment

<u>Purpose and Need for Action</u>: KTWD has requested that its service area boundaries be condensed to exclude ± 18.51 acres (Figure 1). KTWD landowners have requested to be removed from the KTWD boundaries in order to avoid any further assessments on the property.

<u>Proposed Action</u>: Reclamation proposes to approve the exclusion of ± 18.51 acres from KTWD. The assessor parcel number is 339-160-001. KTWD could make changes to their service area upon approval from Reclamation

Pursuant to Bureau of Reclamation's (Reclamation) commitment on inclusions and exclusions presented on pages 2-40 and 2-57 of the Biological Opinion on Implementation of the Central Valley Project Improvement Act and Continued Operation and Maintenance of the Central Valley Project (CVP) (1-1-01-1-0311), Reclamation is hereby notifying the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service of an exclusion.

The District revised their sphere of influence with Tulare County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo) on August 5, 2010 by detaching land (Figure 1). The District has requested that its service area boundaries be condensed to exclude ±18.51 acres (parcel number 339-160-001) and Reclamation's action is the approval of the exclusion.

The proposed action will only affect the quantities of water delivered by the District to the subject properties. Reclamation has made a No Effect determination under the Endangered Species Act (16 U.S.C. §1531 et. seq.) for the proposed federal action of approving the exclusion. Reclamation is not seeking concurrence with this determination. If the Service has any comments on this action, please notify Reclamation in writing within 30 days of receipt of this memo.
