**Nature of Action:** LBAO is proposing to authorize geotechnical investigations on Reclamation withdrawn land below Rye Patch Dam.

The proposed geotechnical investigations will require boring two, 45 to 60-feet deep by 8-inches in diameter holes and a multi-channel analysis to depths of approximately 100-feet using seismic analysis methods. It is proposed, the holes be bored in the parking area near the outlet works of Rye Patch Dam. The holes will be back filled with a cement grout mix plug extending to the surface of the parking area.

The geotechnical investigation is subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The locations of the bore holes will be marked on the ground and the GPS locations provided to Reclamation. Once this information is provided, the locations cannot change without Reclamation approval. Site reviews may be required by Reclamations geotechnical and/or cultural resources staff members.
- 2. The bore holes will be backfilled with a cement grout with 5 percent by weight bentonite mix places with a tremie pipe from the bottom to the top of the hole, and extending to the surface of the parking area. Reclamation geotechnical specialists will provide necessary mix requirements.
- 3. Construction activities shall meet all Federal, County, and Local standards and guidelines for construction safety. Underground utilities must be located and avoided.
- 4. Best Management Practices will be incorporated to prevent sediment runoff into the Humboldt River.

The proposed geotechnical investigation is anticipated to begin February 2012.

**Location:** The project site is located at Rye Patch Dam, Pershing County, Humboldt Project, Nevada.

Rye Patch Dam Power Plant Geotechnical Study, Pershing County, Nevada

Julia,

The Bureau of Reclamation proposes to permit Pershing County Water Conservation District (PCWCD) to drill two eight inch bore holes on a portion of Reclamation's Rye Patch Dam Facility in Pershing County, Nevada. Reclamation's approval of the geotechnical investigation by PCWCD constitutes an undertaking as defined by Section 301(7) of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) (16 U.S.C. 470), as amended.

Reclamation therefore consulted with the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) in accordance with the regulations at 36 CFR Part 800 implementing Section 106 of the NHPA. Reclamation identified the Rye Patch Dam as a historic property eligible for listing in the National Register under Criterion A and Criterion C for its association with the Depression Era Relief Theme and the Irrigation and Reclamation Theme at the local level. Reclamation also determined that the proposed geotechnical study would result in no adverse effect to historic properties pursuant to 36 CFR § 800.5(b) and submitted a consultation package and supporting documentation to the SHPO on January 19, 2012. Reclamation was notified via phone by the SHPO on February 27, 2012 that SHPO concurred with our and that the concurrence letter from SHPO was mailed to Reclamation on February 22, 2012.

The concurrence by SHPO completes the Section 106 process for the geotechnical study. The information from the bore holes will be used for planning a power plant proposed by PCWCD. That larger power plant project itself will be the subject of a separate Section 106 consultation at a later date after design details are more complete.

For the geotechnical study I can now concur with Item 8 on CEC LO-2011-1016, dated January 19, 2012.
