Nature of Action: The Applicant, Frey Ranch LLC has requested Lahontan Basin Area Office (LBAO) consent to install a driveway crossing over the H5 Drain at Pasture Road, located approximately 10 miles south of Fallon, Churchill County, Nevada. The purpose of the driveway is to provide access for farm equipment from Pasture Road to the applicant's agricultural fields. The applicant is the underlying property owner.

The proposal includes placing up to a 48 inch by 50 foot plastic culvert pipe in the bottom of the drain. Earthen fill would be placed on top of the pipe and compacted, which will create the access point to the private property. The width of the driveway would be approximately 20 feet wide. All earthen fill and surfacing would be constructed using native materials. Refer to photos and map on pages 5 and 6.

Reclamation engineering has reviewed the proposed design for the crossing and concluded it is adequate for maintenance of project function. Responsibility for maintaining the crossing would remain with the landowner.

The applicant has indicated they would like to begin construction of the crossing before the irrigation season begins in Spring 2012.

Location: The project site is located in the Newlands Project Area, approximately 10 miles south of Fallon, Churchill County, Nevada.





Julia,

In reference to CEC Number LO-2012-1004, the action to consent to the placement of one culvert pipe in the H5 Drain, a Reclamation conveyance facility of the Newlands Project, was determined to not meet the definition of a Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) undertaking (36 CFR Part 800.16y). Reclamation owns the conveyance via an 1890's Canal Act Easement but does not retain landowner status to the land. Reclamation has management responsibilities to its historic properties, and will determine if the drain is eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places (National Register) and seek a consensus determination with the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO).

Due to the fact that there is not a Section 106 undertaking and that the placement of the culvert pipe in the H5 Drain will not hinder Reclamation's ability to move and deliver water, Reclamation can now close the Section 106 process by stating that the proposed project is not an undertaking as defined by 36 CFR Part 800.16y.

Please forward MP-153 photographs of the drain after the culvert has been installed and retain a copy of this e-mail for the administrative record for this project.
