
Background: Rag Gulch Water District (RGWD) has revised their Sphere of Influence with the Kern County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo) by detaching land. The LAFCo actions occurred on March 23, 2011 and May 25, 2011. These actions would only affect the quantities of water delivered by the appropriate districts for the subject territory. There would be no upgrade needed to existing facilities as a result of the annexation. RGWD has requested that its service area boundaries be condensed to exclude ± 325.88 acres (Figure 1).

<u>Purpose and Need for Action</u>: The reason for the proposed actions is that RGWD no longer delivers any supplied water to the territory proposed to be detached and the landowners do not require a water supply from RGWD.

Proposed Action: Reclamation proposes to approve the detachment of ± 325.88 acres from RGWD. See Table 1 for Assessor's Parcel Numbers and Figure 1 for project location.
