AMENDMENT TO THE EXISTING CONTRACT BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND

CENTERVILLE COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT PROVIDING FOR WATER SERVICE AND FACILITIES REPAYMENT

1	THIS AMENDMENT ("Amendment") to Long-Term Renewal Contract Between the
2	United States and Centerville Community Services District Providing For Project Water Services
3	From the Trinity River Division ("Existing Contract") (collectively, "Contract"), is made this
4	284 day of September, 2020, in pursuance generally of the Act of June 17, 1902, (32 Stat.
5	388), and acts amendatory thereof or supplementary thereto, including but not limited to, the
6	Acts of August 26, 1937 (50 Stat. 844), as amended and supplemented, August 4, 1939 (53 Stat.
7	1187), as amended and supplemented, July 2, 1956 (70 Stat. 483), June 21, 1963 (77 Stat. 68),
8	October 12, 1982 (96 Stat. 1263), October 27, 1986 (100 Stat. 3050), as amended, Title XXXIV
9	of the Act of October 30, 1992 (106 Stat. 4706), as amended, and the Water Infrastructure
10	Improvements for the Nation Act (Public Law 114-322,130 Stat. 1628), Section 4011 (a-d) and
11	(f) ("WIIN Act"), all collectively hereinafter referred to as Federal Reclamation law, between the
12	UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, hereinafter referred to as the United States, represented by
13	the officer executing this Amendment, hereinafter referred to as the Contracting Officer, and
14	Centerville Community Services District, hereinafter referred to as the Contractor.
15	WITNESSETH, That:
16	EXPLANATORY RECITALS

17	[1st] WHEREAS, the United States and the Contractor entered into Contract Number
18	14-06-200-3367X-LTR1, which established terms for the delivery of Project Water to the
19	Contractor from the Trinity River Division, as in effect the date the WIIN Act was enacted, and
20	as may have been amended; and
21	[2 nd] WHEREAS, on December 16, 2016, the 114 th Congress of the United States of
22	America enacted the WIIN Act; and
23	[3 rd] WHEREAS, Section 4011(a)(1) provides that "upon request of the contractor, the
24	Secretary of the Interior shall convert any water service contract in effect on the date of
25	enactment of this subtitle and between the United States and a water users' association
26	[Contractor] to allow for prepayment of the repayment contract pursuant to paragraph (2) under
27	mutually agreeable terms and conditions."; and
28	[4th] WHEREAS, Section 4011(a)(1) further provides that "the manner of conversion
29	under this paragraph shall be as follows: (A) Water service contracts that were entered into under
30	section (e) of the Act of August 4, 1939 (53 Stat. 1196), to be converted under this section shall
31	be converted to repayment contracts under section 9(d) of that Act (53 Stat. 1195)"; and "(B)
32	Water service contracts that were entered under subsection (c)(2) of section 9 of the Act of
33	August 4, 1939 (53 Stat. 1194), to be converted under this section shall be converted to a
34	contract under subsection (c)(1) of section 9 of that Act (53 Stat. 1195)."; and
35	[5 th] WHEREAS, Section 4011(a)(4)(C) further provides all contracts entered into
36	pursuant to Section 4011(a)(1), (2), and (3) shall "not modify other water service, repayment,
37	exchange and transfer contractual rights between the water users' association [Contractor], and

38	the Bureau of Reclamation, or any rights, obligations, or relationships of the water users'
39	association [Contractor] and their landowners as provided under State law."; and
40	[6 th] WHEREAS, Section 4011(d)(3) and (4) of the WIIN Act provides that
41	"implementation of the provisions of this subtitle shall not alter(3) the priority of a water
42	service or repayment contractor to receive water; or (4) except as expressly provided in this
43	section, any obligations under the reclamation law, including the continuation of Restoration
44	Fund charges pursuant to section 3407(d) (Public Law 102-575), of the water service and
45	repayment contractors making prepayments pursuant to this section."; and
46	[7 th] WHEREAS, upon the request of the Contractor, the WIIN Act directs the
47	Secretary to convert municipal and industrial (M&I) water service contracts into repayment
48	contracts, amend existing repayment contracts, and allow contractors to prepay their construction
49	cost obligations pursuant to applicable Federal Reclamation law; and
50	[8th] WHEREAS, the Contracting Officer and the Contractor agree to amend the
51	Existing Contract with the execution of this Amendment; and
52	[9 th] WHEREAS, the Contracting Officer and the Contractor agree that this
53	Amendment complies with Section 4011 of the WIIN Act.
54	NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants herein contained, it is hereby
55	mutually agreed by the parties hereto as follows:
56	1. Article 1 of the Existing Contract, entitled <u>DEFINITIONS</u> is amended as
57	follows:
58	a. Subdivisions (m), (o) and (t) of Article 1 of the Existing Contract are
59	amended and replaced in their entirety with the following new subdivisions (m), (o) and (t):

61 62	land primarily for the production of commercial agricultural crops or livestock, and domestic and other uses that are incidental thereto.
63 64 65	(o) "Municipal and Industrial Water" shall mean the use of Project Water for municipal, industrial, and miscellaneous other purposes not falling under the definition of Irrigation Water or within another category of water use under an applicable Federal authority
66 67 68	(t) "Project Contractors" shall mean all parties who have contracts for water service for Project Water from the Project with the United States pursuant to Federal Reclamation law.
69	b. Subdivisions (dd) through (ff) are added at the end of Article 1 of the
70	Existing Contract as follows:
71	(dd) "Additional Capital Obligation" shall mean construction costs or
72	other capitalized costs incurred after November 1, 2020 or not reflected in the Existing Capital
73	Obligation as defined herein and in accordance with Section 4011, subsection (a)(2)(B) and
74	(a)(3)(B) of the Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation Act (Public Law 114-322,130
75	Stat. 1628) ("WIIN Act").
76	(ee) "Existing Capital Obligation" shall mean the remaining amount of
77	construction costs or other capitalized costs allocable to the Contractor as described in section
78	4011, subsections (a)(2)(A) and (a)(3)(A) of the WIIN Act, and as identified in the Central
79	Valley Project Irrigation Water Rates and/or Municipal and Industrial Water Rates, respectively,
30	the Central Valley Project 2020 Ratebooks, as adjusted to reflect payments not reflected in such
3 1	schedule. The Contracting Officer has computed the Existing Capital Obligation and such
32	amount is set forth in Exhibit C, which is incorporated herein by reference.
33	(ff) "Repayment Obligation" shall mean the amount due and payable
34	to the United States, pursuant to the section 4011(a)(3)(A) of the WIIN Act.

2. Article 2 of the Existing Contract, entitled <u>TERM OF CONTRACT</u>, is amended and replaced in its entirety with the following new Article 2:

- 2. (a) This Contract shall be effective November 1, 2020 and shall continue so long as the Contractor pays applicable Rates and Charges under this Contract, consistent with Section 9(d) or 9(c)(1) of the Act of August 4, 1939 (53 Stat. 1195) as applicable, and applicable law;
- (1) Provided, That the Contracting Officer shall not seek to terminate this Contract for failure to fully or timely pay applicable Rates and Charges by the Contactor, unless the Contracting Officer has first provided at least sixty (60) calendar days written notice to the Contractor of such failure to pay and Contractor has failed to cure such failure to pay, or to diligently commence and maintain full curative payments satisfactory to the Contracting Officer within the sixty (60) calendar days' notice period;
- seek to suspend making water available or declaring Water Made Available pursuant to this Contract for non-compliance by the Contractor with the terms of this Contract or Federal law, unless the Contracting Officer has first provided at least thirty (30) calendar days written notice to the Contractor and the Contractor has failed to cure such non-compliance, or to diligently commence curative actions satisfactory to the Contracting Officer for a non-compliance that cannot be fully cured within the thirty (30) calendar days' notice period. If the Contracting Officer has suspended making water available pursuant to this paragraph, upon cure of such

105	noncompliance satisfactory to the Contracting Officer, the Contracting Officer shall resume
106	making water available and declaring Water Made Available pursuant to this Contract;
107	(3) <u>Provided further</u> , That this Contract may be terminated at
108	any time by mutual consent of the parties hereto.
109	(b) Upon complete payment of the Repayment Obligation by the
110	Contractor, and notwithstanding any Additional Capital Obligation that may later be established,
111	the acreage limitations, reporting, and the Full Cost pricing provisions of the Reclamation
112	Reform Act of 1982 shall no longer be applicable to the Contractor pursuant to this Contract.
113	(c) OMITTED.
114	(d) Notwithstanding any provision of this Contract, the Contractor
115	reserves and shall have all rights and benefits, under the Act of June 21, 1963 (77.Stat. 68), to the
116	extent allowed by law.
117	3. Article 3, of the Existing Contract, entitled WATER TO BE MADE
118	AVAILABLE AND DELIVERED TO THE CONTRACTOR, is amended as follows:
119	a. Subdivision (h) of Article 3 of the Existing Contract is amended and
120	replaced in its entirety with the following new subdivision (h):
121	(h) The Contractor's right pursuant to Federal Reclamation law and
122	applicable State law to the reasonable and beneficial use of the Water Delivered pursuant to this
123	Contract shall not be disturbed, and this Contract shall continue so long as the Contractor pays
124	applicable Rates and Charges under this Contract consistent with Section 9(d) or 9(c)(1) of the
125	Act of August 4, 1939 (53 Stat. 1195) as applicable, and applicable law. Nothing in the

preceding sentence shall affect the Contracting Officer's ability to impose shortages under
Article 11 or subdivision (b) of Article 12 of this Contract.

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- 4. Article 7 of the Existing Contract, entitled RATES AND METHOD OF PAYMENT FOR WATER, is amended as follows:
- 130 (a) The heading of the Existing Contract is amended and replaced in its entirety with RATES, METHOD OF PAYMENT FOR WATER AND ACCELERATED 132 REPAYMENT OF FACILITIES.
 - (b) Subdivision (a) of Article 7 of the Existing Contract is amended and replaced in its entirety with the following new subdivision (a):
 - Notwithstanding the Contractor's full prepayment of the (a) Repayment Obligation pursuant to section 4011, subsection (a)(2)(A) and subsection (a)(3)A) of the WIIN Act, as set forth in Exhibit C, and any payments required pursuant to section 4011. subsection (b) of the WIIN Act, to reflect the adjustment for the final cost allocation as described in this Article, subsection (b), the Contractor's Project construction and other cost obligations shall be determined in accordance with: (i) the Secretary's ratesetting policy for Irrigation Water adopted in 1988 and the Secretary's then-existing ratesetting policy for M&I Water, consistent with the WIIN Act; and such ratesetting policies shall be amended, modified, or superseded only through a public notice and comment procedure; (ii) applicable Federal Reclamation law and associated rules and regulations, or policies; and (iii) other applicable provisions of this Contract. Payments shall be made by cash transaction, electronic funds transfers, or any other mechanism as may be agreed to in writing by the Contractor and the Contracting Officer. The Rates and

149	(1) The Contractor shall pay the United States as provided for
150	in this Article of this Contract for all Delivered Water at Rates and Charges in accordance with
151	policies for M&I Water. The Contractor's Rates shall be established to recover its estimated
152	reimbursable costs included in the operation & maintenance component of the Rate and amounts
153	established to recover deficits and other charges, if any, including construction costs as identified
154	in the following subdivisions.
155	(2) In accordance with the WIIN Act, the Contractor's
156	allocable share of Project construction costs will be repaid pursuant to the provisions of this
157	Contract.
158	(A) The amount due and payable to the United States,
159	pursuant to the WIIN Act, shall be the Repayment Obligation. The Repayment Obligation has
160	been computed by the Contracting Officer in a manner consistent with the WIIN Act and is set
161	forth as a lump sum payment as set forth in Exhibit C. The Repayment Obligation is due in lump
162	sum within 60 days of the effective date of this Amendment as provided by the WIIN Act.
163	Notwithstanding any Additional Capital Obligation that may later be established, receipt of the
164	Contractor's payment of the Repayment Obligation to the United States shall fully and
165	permanently satisfy the Existing Capital Obligation.
166	(B) Additional Capital Obligations that are not reflected
167	in the schedules referenced in Exhibit C and properly assignable to the Contractor, shall be
168	repaid as prescribed by the WIIN Act without interest except as required by law. Consistent with

Charges applicable to the Contractor upon execution of this Contract are set forth in Exhibit "B,"

Federal Reclamation law, interest shall continue to accrue on the M&I portion of the Additional Capital Obligation assigned to the Contractor until such costs are paid. Increases or decreases in the Additional Capital Obligation assigned to the Contractor caused solely by annual adjustment of the Additional Capital Obligation assigned to each Project contractor by the Secretary shall not be considered in determining the amounts to be paid pursuant to this subdivision (a)(2)(B), however, they will be considered under subdivision (b) of this Article. A separate agreement shall be established by the Contractor and the Contracting Officer to accomplish repayment of the Additional Capital Obligation assigned to the Contractor within the timeframe prescribed by the WIIN Act, subject to the following:

(1) If the collective Additional Capital

Obligation properly assignable to the contractors exercising conversion under section 4011 of the WIIN Act is less than five million dollars (\$5,000,000), then the portion of such costs properly assignable to the Contractor shall be repaid not more than five (5) years after the Contracting Officer notifies the Contractor of the Additional Capital Obligation; <u>Provided</u>, That the reference to the amount of five million dollars (\$5,000,000) shall not be a precedent in any other context.

Obligation properly assignable to the contractors exercising conversion under section 4011 of the WIIN Act is equal to or greater than five million dollars (\$5,000,000), then the portion of such costs properly assignable to the Contractor shall be repaid as provided by applicable Federal Reclamation law and Project ratesetting policy; <u>Provided</u>, That the reference to the amount of five million dollars (\$5,000,000) shall not be a precedent in any other context.

190	(c) Article 7 of the Existing Contract is amended to add a new
191	subdivision (b); subdivisions (b) through (n) of Article 7 of the Existing Contract are
192	redesignated as subdivisions (c) through (o):
193	(b) In the event that the final cost allocation referenced in Section
194	4011(b) of the WIIN Act determines that the costs properly assignable to the Contractor are
195	greater than what has been paid by the Contractor, the Contractor shall be obligated to pay the
196	remaining allocated costs. The term of such additional repayment contract shall be not less than
197	one (1) year and not more than ten (10) years, however, mutually agreeable provisions regarding
198	the rate of repayment of such amount may be developed by the Contractor and Contracting
199	Officer. In the event that the final cost allocation indicates that the costs properly assignable to
200	the Contractor are less than what the Contractor has paid, the Contracting Officer shall credit
201	such overpayment as an offset against any outstanding or future obligations of the Contractor,
202	with the exception of Restoration Fund charges pursuant to section 3407(d) of Public Law 102-
203	575.
204	5. Article 12 of the Existing Contract, entitled CONSTRAINTS ON THE
205	AVAILABILITY OF WATER, is amended as follows:
206	(a) Subdivisions (a) and (b) of Article 12 of the Existing Contract are
207	amended and replaced in their entirety with the following new subdivisions (a) and (b):
208 209 210 211 212	(a) In its operation of the Project, the Contracting Officer will use all reasonable means to guard against a Condition of Shortage in the quantity of Project Water to be made available to the Contractor pursuant to this Contract. In the event the Contracting Officer determines that a Condition of Shortage appears probable, the Contracting Officer will notify the Contractor of said determination as soon as practicable.
213 214 215	(b) If there is a Condition of Shortage because of inaccurate runoff forecasting or other similar operational errors affecting the Project; drought and other physical or natural causes beyond the control of the Contracting Officer; or actions taken by the Contracting

216 217 218	Officer to meet current and future legal obligations, then, except as provided in subdivision (a) of Article 18, no liability shall accrue against the United States or any of its officers, agents, or employees for any damage, direct or indirect, arising therefrom.
219	6. Article 18 of the Existing Contract, entitled OPINIONS AND
220	DETERMINATIONS, is amended to replace subdivision (b) in its entirety with the
221	following new subdivision (b):
222 223 224 225 226	(b) The Contracting Officer shall have the right to make determinations necessary to administer this Contract that are consistent with its expressed and implied provisions, the laws of the United States and the State of California, and the rules and regulations promulgated by the Secretary of the Interior. Such determinations shall be made in consultation with the Contractor.
227	7. Article 15 of the Existing Contract, entitled <u>WATER AND AIR</u>
228	POLLUTION CONTROL and Article 16 of the Existing Contract, entitled QUALITY OF
229	WATER, are amended and replaced in their entirety with a new Article 15 as follows:
230	PROTECTION OF WATER AND AIR QUALITY
231	15. (a) OMITTED.
232 233 234 235 236	(b) The United States will care for, operate and maintain reserved works in a manner that preserves the quality of the water at the highest level possible as determined by the Contracting Officer. The United States does not warrant the quality of the water delivered to the Contractor and is under no obligation to furnish or construct water treatment facilities to maintain or improve the quality of water delivered to the Contractor.
237 238 239 240 241 242 243	(c) The Contractor will comply with all applicable water and air pollution laws and regulations of the United States and the State of California; and will obtain all required permits or licenses from the appropriate Federal, State, or local authorities necessary for the delivery of water by the Contractor; and shall be responsible for compliance with all Federal, State, and local water quality standards applicable to surface and subsurface drainage and/or discharges generated through the use of Federal or Contractor facilities or Project Water provided by the Contractor within the its Project Water Service Area.
244 245	(d) This Article shall not affect or alter any legal obligations of the Secretary to provide drainage or other discharge services.

247	amended and redesignated as Articles 16 through 37.
248	9. Article 20, redesignated Article 19, of the Existing Contract, entitled
249	CHARGES FOR DELINQUENT PAYMENTS, is amended and replaced in its entirety
250	with the following new Article 19:
251 252 253 254 255 256 257 258 259 260	19. (a) The Contractor shall be subject to interest, administrative, and penalty charges on delinquent payments. If a payment is not received by the due date, the Contractor shall pay an interest charge on the delinquent payment for each day the payment is delinquent beyond the due date. If a payment becomes 60 days delinquent, the Contractor shall pay, in addition to the interest charge, an administrative charge to cover additional costs of billing and processing the delinquent payment. If a payment is delinquent 90 days or more, the Contractor shall pay, in addition to the interest and administrative charges, a penalty charge for each day the payment is delinquent beyond the due date, based on the remaining balance of the payment due at the rate of 6 percent per year. The Contractor shall also pay any fees incurred for debt collection services associated with a delinquent payment.
261 262 263 264	(b) The interest rate charged shall be the greater of either the rate prescribed quarterly in the <u>Federal Register</u> by the Department of the Treasury for application to overdue payments, or the interest rate of 0.5 percent per month. The interest rate charged will be determined as of the due date and remain fixed for the duration of the delinquent period.
265 266 267	(c) When a partial payment on a delinquent account is received, the amount received shall be applied first to the penalty charges, second to the administrative charges, third to the accrued interest, and finally to the overdue payment.
268	10. Article 21, redesignated Article 20, of the Existing Contract, entitled <u>EQUAL</u>
269	OPPORTUNITY, is amended and replaced in its entirety with the following new Article
270	20:
271	EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY
272	20. During the performance of this Contract, the Contractor agrees as follows:
273 274 275 276 277	(a) The Contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. The Contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. Such action shall

include, but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the Contracting Officer setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

- (b) The Contractor will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin.
- (c) The contractor will not discharge or in any other manner discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because such employee or applicant has inquired about, discussed, or disclosed the compensation of the employee or applicant or another employee or applicant. This provision shall not apply to instances in which an employee who has access to the compensation information of other employees or applicants as part of such employee's essential job functions discloses the compensation of such other employees or applicants to individuals who do not otherwise have access to such information, unless such disclosure is in response to a formal complaint or charge, in furtherance of an investigation, proceeding, hearing, or action, including an investigation conducted by the employer, or is consistent with the contractor's legal duty to furnish information.
- (d) The Contractor will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice, to be provided by the Contracting Officer, advising the labor union or workers' representative of the Contractor's commitments under section 202 of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
- (e) The Contractor will comply with all provisions of Executive Order No. 1.1246 of Sept. 24, 1965, and of the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.
- (f) The Contractor will furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order No. 11246 of September 24, 1965, and by the rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or pursuant thereto, and will permit access to his books, records, and accounts by the Contracting Agency and the Secretary of Labor for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with such rules, regulations, and orders.
- (g) In the event of the Contractor's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination clauses of this Contract or with any of such rules, regulations, or orders, this Contract may be canceled, terminated or suspended in whole or in part and the Contractor may be declared ineligible for further Government contracts in accordance with procedures authorized in Executive Order No. 11246 of Sept. 24, 1965, and such other sanctions may be

316 317	imposed and remedies invoked as provided in Executive Order No. 11246 of September 24, 1965, or by rule, regulation, or order of the Secretary of Labor, or as otherwise provided by law.
318 319 320 321 322 323 324 325 326 327	(h) The Contractor will include the provisions of paragraphs (a) through (h) in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by the rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to section 204 of Executive Order No. 11246 of September 24, 1965, so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor. The Contractor will take such action with respect to any subcontract or purchase order as may be directed by the Secretary of Labor as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for noncompliance: <i>Provided, however</i> , that in the event the Contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or vendor as a result of such direction, the Contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.


