AMENDMENT TO THE EXISTING CONTRACT BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND STONY CREEK WATER DISTRIC PROVIDING FOR WATER SERVICE AND FACILITIES REPAYMENT

1	THIS AMENDMENT ("Amendment") to Long-Term Renewal Contract Between the
2	United States and Stony Creek Water District Providing for Project Water Service from the
3	Black Butte Project ("Existing Contract") (collectively, "Contract"), is made this 15th day of
4	September, 2020, in pursuance generally of the Act of June 17, 1902, (32 Stat. 388), and acts
5	amendatory thereof or supplementary thereto, including but not limited to, the Acts of August
6	26, 1937 (50 Stat. 844), as amended and supplemented, August 4, 1939 (53 Stat. 1187), as
7	amended and supplemented, July 2, 1956 (70 Stat. 483), June 21, 1963 (77 Stat. 68), October 12,
8	1982 (96 Stat. 1263), October 27, 1986 (100 Stat. 3050), as amended, Title XXXIV of the Act of
9	October 30, 1992 (106 Stat. 4706), as amended, and the Water Infrastructure Improvements for
10	the Nation Act (Public Law 114-322,130 Stat. 1628), Section 4011 (a-d) and (f) ("WIIN Act"),
11	all collectively hereinafter referred to as Federal Reclamation law, between the UNITED
12	STATES OF AMERICA, hereinafter referred to as the United States, represented by the officer
13	executing this Amendment, hereinafter referred to as the Contracting Officer, and Stony Creek
14	Water District, hereinafter referred to as the Contractor.
15	WITNESSETH, That:

.6	EXPLANATORY RECITALS
7	[1st] WHEREAS, the United States and the Contractor entered into Contract Number
8	20-07-20-W0261-LTR1, which established terms for the delivery of Project Water to the
9	Contractor from the Black Butte Division, as in effect the date the WIIN Act was enacted, and as
20	may have been amended; and
21	[1.1] Whereas the 2 nd Recital of the Existing Contract is amended and replaced in
22	its entirety with the following new 2 nd Recital:
23	WHEREAS, under Application #18115 and Permit #13776 the United States
24	constructed the Black Butte Dam and Reservoir which were integrated into the Project
25	and which will be used in part for the furnishing of water to the Contractor pursuant to
26	the terms of this Contract; and
27	[1.2] Whereas Recital 2.2 of the Existing Contract is amended and replaced in its
28	entirety with the following new Recital 2.2:
29	WHEREAS, under Application #18115 and Permit #13776 the United States is
30	willing to make water stored in the Black Butte Reservoir available to the Contractor
31	from the East Park Reservoir of the Orland Project pursuant to the exchange Contract No
32	14-06-200-1020A, dated June 26, 1964, between the United States and the Orland Unit
33	Water Users' Association; and
34	[2 nd] WHEREAS, on December 16, 2016, the 114 th Congress of the United States of
35	America enacted the WIIN Act; and
36	[3 rd] WHEREAS, Section 4011(a)(1) provides that "upon request of the contractor, the
37	Secretary of the Interior shall convert any water service contract in effect on the date of

enactment of this subtitle and between the United States and a water users' association 39 [Contractor] to allow for prepayment of the repayment contract pursuant to paragraph (2) under 40 mutually agreeable terms and conditions."; and [4th] 41 WHEREAS, Section 4011(a)(1) further provides that "the manner of conversion 42 under this paragraph shall be as follows: (A) Water service contracts that were entered into under 43 section (e) of the Act of August 4, 1939 (53 Stat. 1196), to be converted under this section shall 44 be converted to repayment contracts under section 9(d) of that Act (53 Stat. 1195)"; and "(B) 45 Water service contracts that were entered under subsection (c)(2) of section 9 of the Act of 46 August 4, 1939 (53 Stat. 1194), to be converted under this section shall be converted to a 47 contract under subsection (c)(1) of section 9 of that Act (53 Stat. 1195)."; and [5th] 48 WHEREAS, Section 4011(a)(4)(C) further provides all contracts entered into 49 pursuant to Section 4011(a)(1), (2), and (3) shall "not modify other water service, repayment, 50 exchange and transfer contractual rights between the water users' association [Contractor], and 51 the Bureau of Reclamation, or any rights, obligations, or relationships of the water users' 52 association [Contractor] and their landowners as provided under State law."; and [6th] 53 WHEREAS, Section 4011(d)(3) and (4) of the WIIN Act provides that 54 "implementation of the provisions of this subtitle shall not alter...(3) the priority of a water 55 service or repayment contractor to receive water; or (4) except as expressly provided in this 56 section, any obligations under the reclamation law, including the continuation of Restoration 57 Fund charges pursuant to section 3407(d) (Public Law 102-575), of the water service and 58 repayment contractors making prepayments pursuant to this section."; and

59	[7 th] WHEREAS, upon the request of the Contractor, the WIIN Act directs the
60	Secretary to convert irrigation and municipal and industrial (M&I) water service contracts into
61	repayment contracts, amend existing repayment contracts, and allow contractors to prepay their
62	construction cost obligations pursuant to applicable Federal Reclamation law; and
63	[8 th] WHEREAS, the Contracting Officer and the Contractor agree to amend the
64	Existing Contract with the execution of this Amendment; and
65	[9 th] WHEREAS, the Contracting Officer and the Contractor agree that this
66	Amendment complies with Section 4011 of the WIIN Act.
67	NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants herein contained, it is hereby
68	mutually agreed by the parties hereto as follows:
69	1. Article 1 of the Existing Contract, entitled <u>DEFINITIONS</u> is amended as
70	follows:
71	a. Subdivisions (m), (o) and (t) of Article 1 of the Existing Contract are
72	amended and replaced in their entirety with the following new subdivisions (m), (o) and (t):
73 74 75	(m) "Irrigation Water" shall mean the use of Project Water to irrigate land primarily for the production of commercial agricultural crops or livestock, and domestic and other uses that are incidental thereto.
76 77 78	(o) "Municipal and Industrial Water" shall mean the use of Project Water for municipal, industrial, and miscellaneous other purposes not falling under the definition of Irrigation Water or within another category of water use under an applicable Federal authority.
79 80 81	(t) "Project Contractors" shall mean all parties who have contracts for water service for Project Water from the Project with the United States pursuant to Federal Reclamation law.
82	b. Subdivisions (ff) through (hh) are added at the end of Article 1 of the
83	Existing Contract as follows:

84	(ff) "Additional Capital Obligation" shall mean construction costs or
85	other capitalized costs incurred after November 1, 2020 or not reflected in the Existing Capital
86	Obligation as defined herein and in accordance with Section 4011, subsection (a)(2)(B) and
87	(a)(3)(B) of the Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation Act (Public Law 114-322,130
88	Stat. 1628) ("WIIN Act").
89	(gg) "Existing Capital Obligation" shall mean the remaining amount of
90	construction costs or other capitalized costs allocable to the Contractor as described in section
91	4011, subsections (a)(2)(A) and (a)(3)(A) of the WIIN Act, and as identified in the Central
92	Valley Project Irrigation Water Rates and/or Municipal and Industrial Water Rates, respectively,
93	the Central Valley Project 2020 Ratebooks, as adjusted to reflect payments not reflected in such
94	schedule. The Contracting Officer has computed the Existing Capital Obligation and such
95	amount is set forth in Exhibit D, which is incorporated herein by reference.
96	(hh) "Repayment Obligation" for Water Delivered as Irrigation Water
97	shall mean the Existing Capital Obligation discounted by ½ of the Treasury rate, which shall be
98	the amount due and payable to the United States, pursuant to section 4011(a)(2)(A) of the WIIN
99	Act; and for Water Delivered as M&I Water shall mean the amount due and payable to the
100	United States, pursuant to the section 4011(a)(3)(A) of the WIIN Act.
101	2. Article 2 of the Existing Contract, entitled <u>TERM OF CONTRACT</u> , is
102	amended and replaced in its entirety with the following new Article 2:
103	2. (a) This Contract shall be effective November 1, 2020 and shall
104	continue so long as the Contractor pays applicable Rates and Charges under this Contract,

consistent with Section 9(d) or 9(c)(1) of the Act of August 4, 1939 (53 Stat. 1195) as applicable, and applicable law;

- (1) <u>Provided</u>, That the Contracting Officer shall not seek to terminate this Contract for failure to fully or timely pay applicable Rates and Charges by the Contactor, unless the Contracting Officer has first provided at least sixty (60) calendar days written notice to the Contractor of such failure to pay and Contractor has failed to cure such failure to pay, or to diligently commence and maintain full curative payments satisfactory to the Contracting Officer within the sixty (60) calendar days' notice period;
- (2) <u>Provided further,</u> That the Contracting Officer shall not seek to suspend making water available or declaring Water Made Available pursuant to this Contract for non-compliance by the Contractor with the terms of this Contract or Federal law, unless the Contracting Officer has first provided at least thirty (30) calendar days written notice to the Contractor and the Contractor has failed to cure such non-compliance, or to diligently commence curative actions satisfactory to the Contracting Officer for a non-compliance that cannot be fully cured within the thirty (30) calendar days' notice period. If the Contracting Officer has suspended making water available pursuant to this paragraph, upon cure of such noncompliance satisfactory to the Contracting Officer, the Contracting Officer shall resume making water available and declaring Water Made Available pursuant to this Contract;
- (3) <u>Provided further</u>, That this Contract may be terminated at any time by mutual consent of the parties hereto.

1	38	Contract shall also be considered terminated.

- 152 (a) The heading of the Existing Contract is amended and replaced in its

 153 entirety with <u>RATES, METHOD OF PAYMENT FOR WATER AND ACCELERATED</u>

 154 <u>REPAYMENT OF FACILITIES.</u>
 - (b) Subdivision (a) of Article 7 of the Existing Contract is amended and replaced in its entirety with the following new subdivision (a):
 - (a) Notwithstanding the Contractor's full prepayment of the Repayment Obligation pursuant to section 4011, subsection (a)(2)(A) and subsection (a)(3)A) of the WIIN Act, as set forth in Exhibit D, and any payments required pursuant to section 4011, subsection (b) of the WIIN Act, to reflect the adjustment for the final cost allocation as described in this Article, subsection (b), the Contractor's Project construction and other cost obligations shall be determined in accordance with: (i) the Secretary's ratesetting policy for Irrigation Water adopted in 1988 and the Secretary's then-existing ratesetting policy for M&I Water, consistent with the WIIN Act; and such ratesetting policies shall be amended, modified, or superseded only through a public notice and comment procedure; (ii) applicable Federal Reclamation law and associated rules and regulations, or policies; and (iii) other applicable provisions of this Contract. Payments shall be made by cash transaction, electronic funds transfers, or any other mechanism as may be agreed to in writing by the Contractor and the Contracting Officer. The Rates and

Charges applicable to the Contractor upon execution of this Contract are set forth in Exhibit "B," as may be revised annually.

- (1) The Contractor shall pay the United States as provided for in this Article of this Contract for all Delivered Water at Rates and Charges in accordance with policies for Irrigation Water and M&I Water. The Contractor's Rates shall be established to recover its estimated reimbursable costs included in the operation & maintenance component of the Rate and amounts established to recover deficits and other charges, if any, including construction costs as identified in the following subdivisions.
- (2) In accordance with the WIIN Act, the Contractor's allocable share of Project construction costs will be repaid pursuant to the provisions of this Contract.
- (A) The amount due and payable to the United States, pursuant to the WIIN Act, shall be the Repayment Obligation. The Repayment Obligation has been computed by the Contracting Officer in a manner consistent with the WIIN Act and is set forth as a lump sum payment (M&I and Irrigation) and as four (4) approximately equal annual installments (Irrigation Only) to be repaid no later than three (3) years after the effective date of this Contract as set forth in Exhibit D. The Repayment Obligation is due in lump sum by December 31, 2020, as provided by the WIIN Act. The Contractor must provide appropriate notice to the Contracting Officer in writing no later than thirty (30) days prior to December 31, 2020, if electing to repay the amount due using the lump sum alternative. If such notice is not provided by such date, the Contractor shall be deemed to have elected the installment payment alternative, in which case, the first such payment shall be made no later than December 31,

2020. The second payment shall be made no later than the first anniversary of the first payment date. The third payment shall be made no later than the second anniversary of the first payment date. The final payment shall be made no later than November 1, 2023. If the installment payment option is elected by the Contractor, the Contractor may pre-pay the remaining portion of the Repayment Obligation by giving the Contracting Officer sixty (60) days written notice, in which case, the Contracting Officer shall re-compute the remaining amount due to reflect the pre-payment using the same methodology as was used to compute the initial annual installment payment amount, which is illustrated in Exhibit D. Notwithstanding any Additional Capital Obligation that may later be established, receipt of the Contractor's payment of the Repayment Obligation to the United States shall fully and permanently satisfy the Existing Capital Obligation.

(B) Additional Capital Obligations that are not reflected in the schedules referenced in Exhibit D and properly assignable to the Contractor, shall be repaid as prescribed by the WIIN Act without interest except as required by law. Consistent with Federal Reclamation law, interest shall continue to accrue on the M&I portion of the Additional Capital Obligation assigned to the Contractor until such costs are paid. Increases or decreases in the Additional Capital Obligation assigned to the Contractor caused solely by annual adjustment of the Additional Capital Obligation assigned to each Project contractor by the Secretary shall not be considered in determining the amounts to be paid pursuant to this subdivision (a)(2)(B), however, will be considered under subdivision (b) of this Article. A separate agreement shall be established by the Contractor and the Contracting Officer to accomplish repayment of the

212	Additional Capital Obligation assigned to the Contractor within the timelrame prescribed by the
213	WIIN Act, subject to the following:
214	(1) If the collective Additional Capital
215	Obligation properly assignable to the contractors exercising conversion under section 4011 of the

224	Reclamation law and Project ratesetting policy; Provided, That the reference to the amount of
225	five million dollars (\$5,000,000) shall not be a precedent in any other context.
226	(c) Article 7 of the Existing Contract is amended to add a new
227	subdivision (b); subdivisions (b) through (n) of Article 7 of the Existing Contract are
228	redesignated as subdivisions (c) through (o):
229	(b) In the event that the final cost allocation referenced in Section
230	4011(b) of the WIIN Act determines that the costs properly assignable to the Contractor are
231	greater than what has been paid by the Contractor, the Contractor shall be obligated to pay the
232	remaining allocated costs. The term of such additional repayment contract shall be not less than
233	one (1) year and not more than ten (10) years, however, mutually agreeable provisions regarding

234	the rate of repayment of such amount may be developed by the Contractor and Contracting
235	Officer. In the event that the final cost allocation indicates that the costs properly assignable to
236	the Contractor are less than what the Contractor has paid, the Contracting Officer shall credit
237	such overpayment as an offset against any outstanding or future obligations of the Contractor,
238	with the exception of Restoration Fund charges pursuant to section 3407(d) of Public Law 102-
239	575.
240	5. Article 12 of the Existing Contract, entitled CONSTRAINTS ON THE
241	AVAILABILITY OF WATER, is amended as follows:
242	(a) Subdivisions (a) and (b) of Article 12 of the Existing Contract are
243	amended and replaced in their entirety with the following new subdivisions (a) and (b):

If a payment becomes 60 days delinquent, the Contractor shall pay, in addition to the interest charge, an administrative charge to cover additional costs of billing and processing the delinquent payment. If a payment is delinquent 90 days or more, the Contractor shall pay, in addition to the interest and administrative charges, a penalty charge for each day the payment is delinquent beyond the due date, based on the remaining balance of the payment due at the rate of 6 percent per year. The Contractor shall also pay any fees incurred for debt collection services associated with a delinquent payment.


