Greeting Leslie,

I pressed the wrong button awhile ago in my last email. The Kaibab Band of Paiutes regrets not attending the Tribal Leaders Water Policy Council Meeting on Thursday, March 9, 2017 at the Heard Museum. Prior commitments and distance kept the Tribe away.

The Kaibab Tribe has concerns which have been neglected over the decades by the BOR, Nevada Power (Los Angeles Water Dept.), Salt River Project, Tucson Electric Power, and CAP. The reservation happens to be located approximately 60 miles west of the NGS, we the (Tribe) happen to be a non-gaming entity, therefore the tribe has no economic enterprises with the exception of a convenience store/gas station. And happen to be located three hundred fifty (350) miles north of Phoenix.

The Tribe has the McClough Transmission Line crossing its reservation boundaries from the Page Power Plant to its final destination in California. As all the concessions are below to the Lower Colorado River Tribes, is good for them, but a bust for the Tribe who is near the Plant.

The Tribe has desires/wants, but it takes funds. Such as:

1. Lawyer's funds to quantify water rights to the Colorado River.
2. Funds for Playground renovations/new construction.
3. Funds for Housing shortage.
4. Funds to purchase road maintenance equipment.
5. Funds for the maintenance and improvement to the roads.
6. Economic Development ventures.

Your immediate attention is appreciated, please forward the Tribe's concerns to all who can lend a hand-up. If you should

need additional information, please advise.
