This revision, consisting of a title page, this sheet showing official actions taken with respect to the plat, and the following General Map sheets outlining the farm unit boundaries, together with 17 supplemental sheets showing detailed drawings and descriptions of each farm unit, comprises the Seventh revision of the farm unit plat of Irrigation Block 43 of the Columbia Basin Project, dated September 15, 1952, and filed for record in the County Auditor's office of Adams County, Washington on September 22, 1952, Auditor's file No. 41295. Previous revisions were made on December 11, 1953, September 8, 1954, August 16, 1955, August 21, 1956, August 27, 1957 and August 25, 1958.

The revisions in the farm unit plat, Irrigation Block No. 43, consist of:

Also this revised plat shows the irrigable area and classes for each farm unit of the block as designated and established on September 2, 1959 by the Regional Director, Region I, Bureau of Reclamation, for and on behalf of the Secretary of the Interior.

The General Map sheets show in tabular form, the irrigable area in each farm unit by classes of land and the portions within each farm unit required for rights-of-way or designated as Class 5 (temporarily unproductive), Class 6 (non-irrigable), or "high". The land classes indicated in the tabulation on the forms were designated and established on September 2, 1959 by the Regional Director, Region I, Bureau of Reclamation.

for and on behalf of the Secretary of the Interior. Lands in Class 5 are regarded as being temporarily unproductive because of seepage conditions. Lands in class 6 are regarded as non-irrigable. Lands designated as "high" are regarded as being at an elevation beyond the economical reach of the distribution system being provided for the irrigation block. The State of Washington and appropriate counties have furnished; upon the solicitation of the United States, information showing changes in alignment and rights-of-way for public highways and roads under their jurisdiction. To the extent that it has been practicable so to do, these data have been correctly placed and shown on this revised plat. The final irrigable area established for each farm unit will be announced and fixed for the purposes of water service and project construction repayment by an announcement issued by the Secretary of the Interior to the Irrigation District prior to the end of the development period of the block as provided for in the repayment contract of October 9, 1945, as amended, between the United States of America and the East Columbia Basin Irrigation District, recorded in Adams County, Washington in Volume I of Columbia Basin Documents, pages 62 to 123, inclusive.

In considering these revisions, investigations and studies were made of the lands in the block and the project as a whole with the object of determining the area, shape and boundaries of the various farm units in this block, having in mind the requirements of the Columbia Basin Project Act (57 Stat. 14) and of Chapter 275, Laws of Washington, 1943, as amended, and of the policies established thereunder by the Secretary of the Interior. Based on these studies and investigations and all relevant data brought forward since the filing of the farm unit plat, I find that the units as herein revised are of sufficient acreage for the support of an average-sized family at a suitable living level and have appropriate shapes and boundaries, having in mind the character of the soil, topography, location with respect to the irrigation system, and all other factors that are relevant to the determination of the area and boundaries of the farm units. Accordingly, acting pursuant to the authority delegated to the Commissioner of Reclamation by the Secretary of the Interior, as shown by Departmental Order 2765, dated July 30, 1954, and redelegated to me by the Commissioner of Reclamation by Commissioner's Order 34, dated October 6, 1954, and Commissioner's Order 34 Amendment 1, dated October 29, 1954, all as recorded in the Auditor's office of Adams County, Washington, in Volume 5 of Columbia Basin Documents at page 556, and pursuant to the provisions of the Columbia Basin Project Act as amended, and Chapter 275, Laws of Washington, 1943, as amended, and the repayment contract of October 9, 1945, as amended, between the United States of America and the East Columbia Basin Irrigation District, I hereby revise the farm unit plat of Irrigation Block 43, dated September 15, 1952, by (1) Replacing the General Map sheets of that plat with the General Map sheets of this plat and (2) Replacing supplemental sheets 9 and 13 of the plat revision recorded December 11, 1953 and supplemental sheets 2 and 3 of the plat revision recorded August 16, 1955 and supplemental sheets 2, 3 and 6 of the plat revision recorded August 27, 1957 and supplemental sheets 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 11 of the plat revision recorded August 25, 1958 as revised, with sheets 1 through 17 respectively, of this plat.
