## **Agency Roles and Responsibilities**

In general, the following table lists agency responsibilities with regard to repayment of power costs at Bureau of Reclamation projects. FAC 04-07 and Appendix A do not establish responsibilities for Power Marketing Administrations (PMAs) - or any agency or entity external to the Bureau of Reclamation.

Reclamation	PMAs
Establish actual and future power costs.	Establish actual and future transmission and power marketing costs.
Determine cost and sub-cost allocations.	Provide cost data to Reclamation for cost and sub-cost allocation processes.
Provide costs allocated to power to PMAs.	Provide transmission and power revenue requirements to Reclamation.
Determine and implement Project Use Power rate and/or cost recovery. Provide Project Use Power costs and revenues data to PMAs.	Provide support for Project Use Power rate and/or cost recovery allocation development.
Confer with PMAs regarding sufficiency of revenue to cover expected costs.	Develop and implement power rate(s) design. Confer with Reclamation regarding sufficiency of revenue to cover expected costs.
Provide support and data for Power Repayment Study (PRS).	Develop the PRS.
Establish and manage ability-to-pay calculations.	Places costs beyond water users' ability-to-pay into PRS.
Provide support to PMAs during rate(s) process.	Administer power rate(s) process, including 10 CFR 903, Procedures for Public Participation in Power and Transmission Rate Adjustments and Extensions, as amended.
Administer applicable Reclamation Fund sub accounts and/or other project-specific funds within Treasury. Coordinate the transfer of funds to/from PMAs, as necessary.	Administer applicable Reclamation Fund sub accounts and transfer power revenue to Reclamation or directly transfer to appropriate fund(s). Coordinate the transfer of funds to/from Reclamation, as necessary.
