Reclamation Manual

Directives and Standards

At a minimum, the Lease of Power Privilege (LOPP) lead will ensure that the following topic areas are considered for study based on project requirements.

- 1. Public and dam safety impacts/modifications (Note: the Bureau of Reclamation reserves the right to conduct or direct these activities including design, construction, and construction inspection at the cost of the lessee).
- 2. Site characteristics and existing facilities.
- 3. Land rights, including but not limited to acquisitions, easements, leases, licenses, consent documents, and other use authorizations.
- 4. Hydraulics and hydrology.
- 5. Sedimentation study.
- 6. Water rights.
- 7. Project features and design.
- 8. Power production.
- 9. Environmental analysis suitable for Reclamation's use in the National Environmental Policy Act, National Historic Preservation Act, Endangered Species Act compliance, and other statutory compliance.
- 10. Safety assessment.
- 11. Physical security and cybersecurity assessment.
- 12. Operation and maintenance plan.
- 13. Project development plan and construction schedule; and
- 14. Additional studies as requested by the LOPP lead.
