## A. Application of this SPD:

- i. The title SOH Manager may be used at any organizational level within the Department of the Interior. This includes, but is not limited to, SOH positions located at Area Offices/Field Offices/Powerplants (USBR).
- ii. All 0018 positions at the GS-11 or GS-12 grade level, who are the only 0018 positions assigned to support the offices/locations identified above, are responsible for planning, organizing, directing, operating, and evaluating their local SOH programs will be assigned to this SPD and therefore be titled SOH Managers on their official position descriptions.
