## Directives and Standards

<b>Subject:</b>	Reclamation Standard Water-Related Contract Articles, Standard Article 32: Constraints on the Availability of Water
<b>Purpose:</b>	To provide the text of and requirements for the application of Standard Article 32: Constraints on the Availability of Water (Standard Article 32), for the benefit of supporting general policy and specific requirements set forth in Reclamation Manual Policy, <i>Reclamation Standard Water-Related Contract Articles</i> (PEC P10).
<b>Authority:</b>	The Reclamation Act of 1902 (ch. 1093, 32 Stat. 388), and acts amendatory and supplementary thereto.
<b>Approving Official:</b>	Director, Policy and Administration

1. **Introduction.** The applicability of Standard Article 32 can be found in Paragraph 4.B. of PEC P10. Standard Article 32 describes the Contracting Officer's responsibility and authority related to water shortages affecting the contract and limits the United States' associated liability.
2. **Applicability.** This Directive and Standard applies to Bureau of Reclamation staff and officials involved in the contracting process, as defined at Paragraph 5.A of PEC P10.
3. **Requirements and Responsibilities.** Reclamation staff and officials involved in the contracting process will include the text below in all contracts requiring Standard Article 32 under Paragraph 4.B. of PEC P10.

### CONSTRAINTS ON THE AVAILABILITY OF WATER<sup>1</sup>

(a) In its operation of the Project, the Contracting Officer will use all reasonable means to guard against a condition of shortage in the quantity of water to be made available to the Contractor pursuant to this Contract. In the event the Contracting Officer determines that a condition of shortage appears probable, the Contracting Officer will notify the Contractor of said determination as soon as practicable.

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(b) If there is a condition of shortage because of inaccurate runoff forecasting or other similar operational errors affecting the Project; drought and other physical or natural causes beyond the control of the Contracting Officer; or actions taken by the Contracting Officer to meet current and future legal obligations, then no liability shall accrue against the United States or any of its officers, agents, or employees for any damage, direct or indirect, arising therefrom.

4. **Definitions.** See Paragraph 5 of PEC P10.

5. **Review Period.** The originating office will review this release every 4 years.
