Subject: Continued Funding of Tribal Participation and Consultation in Glen Canyon

Dam Adaptive Management Program

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide updated information on existing procedures for funding tribal participation and consultation in the Glen Canyon Dam Adaptive Management Program. Tribal participation has been, and will continue to be, an important contribution to the success of this program and the continuing good relationship between the Department of the Interior and participating tribes.

Existing procedures for funding tribal participation are addressed in the attached memorandum issued by this office on June 19, 2001. These methods should be followed until modified by this office. For fiscal year 2004, each agency's identified share for this program is \$95,000. In order to provide adequate funding for this purpose, beginning in fiscal year 2005 an annual consumer price index will be applied to the fiscal year 2004 funding amounts.
