Item 2010.Feb.07	<p>Action item: Have a discussion on scientific controls with GCMRC, and the upper basin RIP; and develop a report from TWG to AMWG.</p> <p><u>July 13, 2010</u>: On this date, Larry Stevens and Shane Capron discussed with Tom Czapl and Tom Chart from the Upper Colorado River Endangered Fish Recovery Program the relevance of an ecological comparison of the little regulated Canyonlands Reach (the lower Colorado and Green River in Canyonlands National Park in Utah) to the highly regulated Colorado River ecosystem (CRE) in Grand Canyon and lowermost Glen Canyon. The call participants expressed interest in assessment of the feasibility and utility of pursuing a comparative river ecosystem analysis of the two reaches.
