	Final Motion: The AMWG believes that in moving forward with any new actions to manage brown trout (BT) in the Lees Ferry reach of the Colorado River, it would be beneficial to work to develop a plan based on the most up to date information and that has involvement from interested members of the AMWG. Accordingly, the AMWG requests that the Secretary of the Interior direct the National Park Service and the Grand Canyon Monitoring and Research Center and request the Arizona Game and Fish Department to organize and facilitate a workshop among scientists, managers, tribes, and interested stakeholders to address: (1) the root causes of the increases in BT, (2) the risks associated with an expanding BT population to a quality rainbow trout fishery in Lees Ferry and the recovery/conservation of humpback chub and other native fish down river, (3) the pros and cons of different experimental and management options to address those risks including but not limited to mechanical removal, trout management flows, and the current High Flow Experiment protocol, (4) the research needs to support more informed decisions moving forward, and (5) management recommendations for minimizing the negative effects of brown trout. Management recommendations should take into consideration expressed tribal concerns regarding the taking of life. Results from the workshop, and any recommended actions based on them, should be reported to the TWG and presented to the AMWG at the August 2017 meeting. <i>Moved by John Jordan, seconded by Larry Stevens, passed by consensus</i> .
