AREAS OF CONCERN

- * Reintroduction of native plant and trees.
- * Invasive Species dominate the river corridor.
- Flash floods in Paria River contribute to sediments being washed out and more erosion become evident by August.

- 2014 Navajo Trip highlighted areas for proposed reintroduction of the Gouldings Willow Tree.
- Collaboration with Hualapai Tribe and Helen Fairly.
- **×** Take clippings from other sources.
- Can only be translocated and planted in fall and winter months.

PRIORITIES FOR REINTRODUCTION

- Re-introduction of the Gouldings Willow tree in selected areas. Areas where they once grew in abundance
- Collaborative effort with the Hualapai tribe
- One boat trip with focus on budget increase and funding for similar projects
- Highly positioned stakeholders invited

- Spring water is collected for ceremonial use
- * Plants collected are used in ceremonies
