Subject: Glen Canyon Dam Adaptive Management Program Workplan Process Direction

The most recent 2021 – 2023 Triennial Workplan and Budget followed a new 3-year cycle to reduce the administrative burden on Glen Canyon Monitoring Research Group (GCMRC), Reclamation, and the Glen Canyon Adaptive Management Program (GCDAMP). It was approved by consensus by the Adaptive Management Work Group (AMWG) in March 2019. The process has been valuable for freeing up time to accomplish the work of the workplan and reduce the time spent on planning, so the new process has been widely considered a success. Under normal circumstances, the GCDAMP would begin development of the 2024-2026 Triennial Workplan (TWP) and Budget. However, 2023 has already shaped up to be a trying year for all. To address the threats aridification pose to the Colorado River, Reclamation and partners are pursuing multiple initiatives, including an Environmental Assessment (EA) to modify releases to address smallmouth bass; and a Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (SEIS) for potential modification of operating guidelines to Glen Canyon and Hoover Dams in 2023-24 and potentially subsequent operating years.

These are high-priority items identified by the Assistant Secretary for Water and Science and the Department of Interior offices. The EA and SEIS will require substantial resources for modeling and analysis from many of the personnel who participate in the development of the Triennial Workplan and Budget. For many involved, the time required to participate in the modeling and analysis exceeds their standard workload, let alone with the additional time required for 2024-2026 TWP development. To alleviate the administrative burden and free up valuable time for researchers and managers, I am proposing a one-year continuation of the 2021-2023 TWP for 2024, after which we'll resume the normal Triennial Workplan process in early CY2024. Minor workplan and budget issues caused by this continuation will be sorted out at DOI and presented to GCDAMP stakeholders. Given our limited resources, I believe this approach will allow us to continue the important research and monitoring activities while addressing the imminent threats on the Colorado River.

FY 24 BAHG Recommendation

The Budget Ad Hoc Group (BAHG) recommends the Fiscal Year 2024 budget as shown on the budget worksheets provided to the BAHG on June 9th, 2023 and attached to this recommendation for consideration by the Technical Work Group (TWG) with the following change:

Move funds from GCMRC Project N: \$29,574 into projects that may have shortfalls, or to the priorities listed below.

If funds become available, the BAHG recommends those funds are used to fund the work items listed below in order of priority:

FY 24 BAHG Recommendation

Priority 1 -Short Term Rapid Response Under the Invasive Species Strategic Plan – Invasive Fish Species Below Glen Canyon Dam: A Strategic Plan to Prevent, Detect and Respond was adopted by the Adaptive Management Work Group (AMWG) on February 16th, 2023. Should short term response be necessary in FY24 under this Strategic Plan, the Department of Interior should prioritize available funds outside of the Glen Canyon Dam Adaptive Management Program. If other funding sources have been exhausted, the Department of Interior may consider use of the Reclamation C.5 Experimental Management Fund and the C.6 Native Fish Conservation Contingency Fund. Such actions that may require use of these funds must be coordinated with the AMWG as proposed in the Strategic Plan and BAHG process.

Priority 2 – Continue Project Element G.6, Juvenile Chub Monitoring-West

Priority 3 – Continue sampling at two sub-reaches for Project Element H.2, Experimental Flow Assessment of Trout Recruitment.

Priority 4 – Continue Project Element C.3, Riparian Vegetation Predictive models and synthesis

Priority 5 – Other Additional Requests identified in the GCMRC FY24 Table.
