I am pleased to appoint you to the Glen Canyon Adaptive Management Work Group, in accordance with the Federal Advisory Committee Act representing the Southern Paiute Consortium. The AMWG was created to facilitate monitoring of the operating criteria and plans adopted for Glen Canyon Dam on the Colorado River, and changes to those operating criteria and plans, and to make recommendations to me concerning suitable monitoring and research programs and other matters related to the requirements of the Glen Canyon Protection Act of October 30, 1992.

I appreciate your willingness to help in this endeavor. Enclosed for your information is a list of the other Advisory Committee Members.

I have appointed Stephen V. Magnussen in the Bureau of Reclamation's Washington Office as my Secretarial Designee, to serve as the Designated Federal Officer and Chairman of the AMWG. Information regarding the first meeting of the full committee has already been sent to your office. Your appointment to the AMWG will be for the remainder of the 4-year term, which began on February 4, 1997, when the AMWG Charter was filed. While serving in this capacity, your travel and per diem expenses will be reimbursed in accordance with current Federal travel regulations.

Subject: Program Formulation Process

At the AMWG meeting on September 10 and 11, Reclamation was requested to provide the members a description of the program formulation process they go through to get funding approved for the Glen Canyon environmental work. Attached is a chart showing the chronology of the process for FY 1999 and FY 2000. As discussed at the meeting, the FY 1999 budget is in the final stages of completion. We have some time to make impacts to the internal portions of the budget but the total funds available are set. The Technical Work Group (TWG) and the Grand Canyon Monitoring and Research Center (CENTER) are working hard on the internal portions to come to final program costs.

For FY 2000, Reclamation is in the process of preparing the budgets. The attached calendar shows the Preliminary FY 2000 BOR Work Program due to the Colorado River Energy Distributors (CREDA) by mid April and the Commissioner's final budget to the Assistant Secretary for Water and Science by mid May. This means the TWG and AMWG need to have the total amount somewhat firm to allow Reclamation to move the budget process forward. The details of the FY 2000 budget can be worked on until sometime in the winter of 1998.

Reclamation will be prepared to answer any questions at the meetings in January.

Steve --

Two thoughts that I wanted to convey to you as we draw close to the first meeting of the Glen Canyon Adaptive Management Work Group on Sept. 10-11. First, we have a lot to cover in that meeting, as you know, but a couple of items are really going to be critical because of the very real possibility of an extremely wet winter/spring with high inflows into Lake Powell. Those items are (1) formation of a Technical Work Group, and (2) Dave Garrett's report on the state of the Canyon's resources combined with Randy Peterson's report on the status of the basin hydrology and ensuing discussion of a potential hydrograph at Glen Canyon for spring of '98.

Initial discussions have already begun regarding a potential spike flow next year and what a process for determining a trigger for doing a spike flow might look like. Those of us who have been involved in those initial discussions are quite sure that the subject must come up and be discussed within the AMWG next week, and that the AMWG will need to task the newly-formed Technical Work Group with working out the details and developing the trigger. Thus, the critical need to both form the Technical Work Group as fully as possible AND have the time for the AMWG to discuss next spring's hydrograph at the meeting next week. As the Secretarial Designee, I hope that you will keep these needs in mind.

The second point that I wanted to convey to you follows from the first. With this very full slate of issues to cover at next week's meeting, and with the possibility that a Technical Work Group will be tasked with an important job, the results of which the AMWG will undoubtedly want to review before they are implemented, I think that it is likely that another AMWG meeting will be needed within 4-5 months of the first. In fact, looking ahead I would suggest a time right around January 15. As Secretarial Designee, you have the authority to call additional meetings of the AMWG (beyond the biannual meetings), so at this point I suggest you merely keep in mind the likelihood that another meeting will prove necessary and perhaps feel out dates with the AMWG members at next week's meeting.

I'm looking forward to this first meeting of the AMWG -- it has been a long time in coming! -- and I hope we can make it productive. If you want to follow up on anything I've laid out in this message, give me a call at (602)
