

Comments on GCMRC Budget

FLIP CHART 1

- S “have to” baseline work should be funded by power revenues and appropriated \$ used for less important work.
- S if we don't get appropriations, re-prioritize
- S concern about funding Mon. of d/s fish community
- S “monitoring” should remain intact year-to-year
- S prepare dual budgets w/ and w/o USGS appropriations
- S power revenues should fund “base” program
- S TWG should be involved in prioritization process

FLIP CHART 2

- S develop paragraph to describe priorities, as well as strategy for obtaining appropriations
- S enlarge tribal involvement
 - p. 18, 1st para. 1st sentence
 - p. 103, C.8 Public outreach activities, general project descriptions → tribes to address sensitive issues
 - P. 129, under Logistics, 1st para., 3rd sentence, → other resources besides PA & ESA.
- S GCMRC should encourage contractors to seek tribal input as appropriate.
- S p. 132, under “independent review panels, 2nd para., peer reviews should include tribal members

FLIP CHART 3

- S outreach → no outreach efforts for tribes (ref. Executive Orders) or add EO to Appendices
- S social cultural → protect sensitive data
- S p. 135, 2nd pp B.O. task group → no tribal representation (“add” AMWG or TWG members)
- S Holocene mapping? → combined with terrestrial mapping (p. 50)
- S desire for a shift for tribes to develop a proactive monitoring program
- S incorporate tribes in developing work plan

FLIP CHART 4

- S only 2 of 16 recreation IN's are being addressed in 2002 plan
- S need to define the Science Advisory Board role (GCMRC vs. AMP) Barry to send white paper to Matt Kaplinski
- S new MO's may change priorities (add paragraph)
- S identify outside work that adds to AMP understanding
- S integration sections weak - add that integration will occur before groups go in the field
- S biomerges work dropped
- S IWQP to go on street for bid? data/reports should be issued

FLIP CHART 5

- S reconvene the recreational ad hoc group to address REC In's and proposed 2002 work
- S comments by Nov. 22.
